PURPOSE

The Magnetism Group organises a full range of activities relevant to the scientific and technical communities working in magnetism. The group runs a regular and lively programme of meetings, both aimed at postgraduate training and at recent developments in magnetism research. The group also sponsors the annual Wohlfarth Memorial Lecture at the Condensed Matter and Materials Physics (CMMP) conference.

The group co-organises sessions at national and international meetings and provides support for other events in magnetism. The group maintains close ties with the UKRI Chapter of the IEEE Magnetics Society and the UK Magnetics Society. One of our aims is to nurture interactions between academic and industrial researchers in the magnetism community. By close links with the EPSRC and industrial representation on the committee, the group works to promote UK activity in magnetism.

- programme of events including conferences and one-day meetings; such as the Current Research in Magnetism (CRIM) meeting and the Experimental and Theoretical Magnetism (ETM) meeting

- access to the group's member network via MyIOP where members may contribute to any number of interesting discussions and debates
